ACPE stands at the crossroads of many vital issues for our communities in education and healing, religious and spirituality. Long Range Development Committee
Southeast Region ACPE
March 25, 2004

The Administrative Board has charged the Long Range Development Committee with the task of initiating and guiding a planning process to begin now, and to continue through completion of particular tasks in 2008. This process would consider our mission as a region, our life as an organization/community, our structure and governance and our leadership needs, including a review of the job description of the Regional Director. It is hoped that this process will involve the body as a whole, so that every voice can be heard, and that we can move forward as a region to meet the challenges of transition and the strengthening of CPE in this region for the future.

The Long Range Development Committee recommends:

- 1 That a New Visions Task Force be authorized to serve for the period 2004-2008, and that this task force include the Long Range Development Committee and additional members named by the body of the region at its 2005 meeting, to ensure representation of generations, diversity and committee leadership experience.

- 2 That the next three regional meetings focus on process of the whole body as it engages the following themes:
 - 2005 Our Mission**—appreciating what we do well, envisioning what we would like our organization to be about in 5-10 years, reaffirming our sense of purpose.
 - 2006 Our Organizational Life**—our values as a community, e.g., full participation, ownership of decision-making, inclusiveness, communication in the work of the region, mutual support, etc., and how structure and governance can better serve and express our values
 - 2007 Our Leadership**—the leadership structure we need for the future, our patterns of leadership selection, what we need from the Regional Director position in the future
 - 2008 Implementation of any structure-governance for the region, and new job description for the Regional Director

- 3 That the Long Range Development Committee be authorized to request funding for this project from the Administrative Board, and that facilitators of this process be utilized as recommended by the Long Range Development Committee/New Visions Task Force.
